## **What AI Can't Replace: A Catholic Perspective**

*Ave Maria University offers free online course that provides the faithful with an intellectually rigorous response to today's most pressing technological questions*

**AVE MARIA, Fla., Jan. 28, 2026** – Artificial intelligence consistently dominates headlines and raises profound questions about human dignity, truth, and the nature of intelligence itself. In an effort to help Catholics better understand AI, both its positive and negative aspects, Ave Maria University has launched a new [Pursuit of Wisdom](#) course designed to bring clarity, balance, and Catholic wisdom to the conversation: “[Demystifying Artificial Intelligence from a Catholic Perspective](#).”

Produced by Ave Maria University and taught by computer scientist Dr. Saverio Perugini, the course offers a sober, intellectually grounded exploration of what AI is — and what it is not — through the lenses of philosophy, theology, literature, and computer science.

“Artificial intelligence has become a kind of modern myth, alternately feared and idolized,” said Dr. Perugini, professor of mathematics and computer science at Ave Maria University. “This course aims to strip away the hype and help people understand AI truthfully, without exaggeration or despair, and always in light of the Church’s teaching on the human person.”

Rather than treating AI as a threat to faith or a substitute for human intelligence, the course presents it as a limited, man-made tool, powerful in narrow domains, but fundamentally incapable of replacing human reason, creativity, or the soul. Drawing on Church documents,

classic philosophical arguments, and literary works such as “Frankenstein,” “Brave New World” and “1984,” the course helps participants recognize why claims of machine “understanding,” “consciousness,” or artificial immortality ultimately fall short of reality.

The course also engages timely concerns facing Catholic educators, parents, clergy and professionals, including data privacy, bias, misinformation and the growing temptation to trust machines over human judgment. Particular attention is given to the Church’s recent reflections on AI and technology, affirming that authentic progress must always serve the dignity of the human person made in the image and likeness of God.
